What's coming out for NOAC????

- * Osceola 564 already have released three two-piece sets and a single NOAC flap, but there will be one more set, and this will be delegate-only.
- * Seminole 85 has shown the art work on the order form for their three two-piece sets. All three are almost identical, with the lodge totem and Michigan State logo on the flap, and a clock tower on the MSU campus depicted on the bottom. The difference is a switch in the green and white colors on the flap. The third set is exactly like one of the other two, with the word DELEGATE embroidered in; however, this set will also be available to the general lodge membership.
- * Echockotee 200 will have multiple patches for NOAC, including a Founders' Day flap and a flap-and-dangle two piece set. Pretty good for a lodge that has never had a NOAC flap before. The samples have been made, and will be ready for the conference (as pictured inside this issue). The lodge has also received permission from the University of Florida to produce a CSP for NOAC, with the University's logo and recognizes the men's basketball team as the 2006 National Champions. Only 500 of these will be made, and are available to the lodge members participating in NOAC, either with the contingent or on staff, in limited quantities.
- * Semialachee 239 is talking about making several flaps, like the four they made in 2004, and a few sets as well. Quite a bit from a small contingent.
- * Aal-Pa-Tah 237 will likely have three more sets, and another Founders' Day patch.
- * Tipisa 326 has already shown the world their NOAC CSP, and the two-piece set that will match it will be out at their Summer event.
- * Timuquan 340 will have at east one two-piece set, with a theme of "Saint Petersburg". Russia, not Florida. The story being told is that some of the design will be in the Cyrillic alphabet of the Russian language.
- * and **O-Shot-Caw 265**? We don't know yet, but it is likely to be a lot.

and as for other stuff.....

- * Seminole 85 will have its 70th anniversary flap available at their Lodge Banquet in May. The design will feature depictions of several versions of their lodge's totem, the ibis.
- * Semialachee 239 was taking orders for a flap and neckerchief, issued in celebration of the 40th anniversary of Wallwood Boy Scout Reservation. This is along with special camp and council patches, including a CSP (Suwannee River Area S-??).
- * North Florida Council's Camp Shands will have its 40th anniversary in 2007, and the Camp Director already has ideas for many patches. No plans, just ideas. Stay tuned.

Notes & Asides

- > Almost as soon as South Florida Council sold McGregor-Smith Scout Reservation to the Southwest Florida Water Management District (aka SWIFTMUD), Gulf Ridge Council worked out a deal to lease part of the property for an environmental camp program.
- > Will NOAC 2006 become known as the Conference of the Lawyers? A new form was hastily issued in mid-April to all contingents and staff members that will hold the BSA and Michigan State University harmless in the event of death or injury, with instructions that no one will participate without it. This was due to the school's demands on the BSA.

Then on May 3, the NOAC website posted a statement that contingents were not allowed to use the Michigan State University logos or trademarks on anything (patches, T-shirts, websites, etc), and for contingents to quit contacting the school to ask permission. We can presume that this is to protect their trademarks, but the statement also made it clear that this was being done because it is an event being held at MSU, and not hosted by or connected to the university. This will be interesting to observe the enforcement of this. Seminole 85 already as stated that they were one of two lodges to receive permission (the other from New York), and it would appear that Osceola 564 didn't ask for permission to use the green helmet logo on their "beaver" NOAC flaps.

NEW ISSUES

> Aal-Pa-ah 237 has a new unrestricted flap (S-87) with a checkerboard background, that matches features in the design of this year's activity patches. Also being made was a special patch for participants in the lodge's Scoutreach program (X-49). Once again, they will be running a pig and turkey roasting booth at the annual council Scout Show, and have two patches for their efforts. The lodge also made a delegate patch to the Section S-4S Conference, using the conference design and changing a few colors and lettering.

> Osceola 564 now has a single NOAC flap, with the same basic design that was used on their flaps last year (S-36). They have also released three two-piece sets (S-37, 39, 39; X-13, 14, 15), with Ordeal, Brotherhood, and Vigil sashes. Their members were referring to these as "the beaver" patches, as the design over the two pieces of the set have a beaver with a Seminole jacket. Why a beaver? Who knows. The flaps also have a depiction of the Michigan State University logo of a green Spartan helmet. Which may be a problem with the university (see the Notes and Asides column for possible reasons why).

> Echockotee 200 made a small flocked-onfelt round (R-12), to be given away or traded, to help promote the 2007 Section Conference, hosted by the lodge. As part of their 2006 activity patch series of Florida Crate Label Art, a contingent patch was made for the Section Conference. Onathequa Chapter has made a patch for their contingent to the 2006 Nok Su Chapter Conch Craziness weekend, with the intent of using the proceeds to pay for gas and tolls.

> Someone felt the need to create a collection of fake flaps, showing lodges that never made a patch, in order to fulfill a need to fill spaces in a collection. These designs that were used never appeared on any sort of official emblem while the lodge existed. And where else but eBay is there a place to try to sell them! How bad was it? The flap for Suriarco Lodge 239 (predecessor name for Semialachee 239) misspelled the SUWANNEE. Is there really a desire among collectors to have a patch that never existed for a lodge, just to fill a non-existent need?






