

What's with the ugly patches?

FROM THE PUBLISHERS

NOAC. Who would have thought when the location of the 2006 National Order of the Arrow Conference was announced two years ago, that the one week of the conference would have the highest temperatures the state of Michigan had ever seen? Or that classrooms that most NOACs get to use would be unavailable for this event? Or that 98% of the rooms used for the National Conference would be devoid of air conditioning (NOAC = NOA/C)?

The Dining Hall food was better than average, the facilities that were available were adequate, but wandering through residence halls to find the lounge where a class was located, just to swelter in 90degree heat and no ventilation got really old really quick. Bureaucratic rulings by the folks with Michigan State University and the state of Michigan were almost punitive in their enforcement, especially when it came to the handling of food and water. One may think that if the welcome mat had not been pulled off the front steps, then it was at least turned upside down before the OA arrived. (How bad? This may have truly been a once-in-alifetime event, as it is doubtful that there will ever be another National Conference at Michigan State.

But what of the patches? There were more emblems than ever before, for a smaller number of lodges. Yet despite original designs and some of the innovative techniques emblem in production, the patches most sought after at the event were those with corporate logos (like Lodge 10's "Sobi" sets), or from recent movies, such as Lodge 42's "Hitchhiker's Guide To The Galaxy" set, or the Lodge 129's "Chronicles of Egwa" patches). None of them were particularly attractive, their trading value was beyond one-for-one for no logical reason, and they will never be worth any more than they were at NOAC.

And another downer to the trading was practice of making the widespread "delegate" items. Those emblems that "special" made represent were to members of lodges fortunate enough to attend NOAC, that deserve to have items "special" to represent their specialness.

And another complaint: the official trading area was the lounge in the student union building, which was always crowded, and a long trek from almost anywhere on campus. It makes us look forward to returning to Indiana University in 2009.

DAVE JAMESON 6/26/55—7/5/06

Dave Jameson was the professional advisor for Semialachee Lodge 239, as well as the ranger at Wallwood Boy Scout Reservation for several years, prior to his promotion to Camp Superintendent. After his arrival in Suwannee River Area Council in 1998, the lodge went through a period of growth and enthusiasm, in large part to his work. As a collector, Arrowman, and a friend, he will be missed by those of us that knew him.

Semialachee Lodge 239 has suffered a great loss with the death of Staff Adviser and Camp Superintendent Dave Jameson. Ranger Dave died on July 5th at his home of a massive heart attack. Dave was a unique person, no less a unique lodge member, and a great friend and mentor to the thousands of Scouts who have passed through the Wallwood Scout Reservation and Semialachee Lodge.

Dave's career in the Order began with his induction in Kiondaga Lodge in his home state of Indiana in 1968. He quickly sealed his membership in the Brotherhood the next year and received the Vigil Honor along with his father in 1973. Appropriately, Dave's Vigil name was "Busy One."

Dave's involvement in the Order continued after he left Kiondaga. He served as a Section Adviser for Section EC-6 for three years, and received the Founder's Award while a member of Wachu Menetopolis Lodge in West Virginia. When Dave moved to Florida, his service to the Order continued in Echokotee Lodge 200 in Jacksonville, where he served in a variety of advising roles.

Dave moved to his most recent home at Wallwood in April of 1998, and he became the Staff Adviser of Semialachee Lodge 239 soon after. His influence on our lodge has been incredible. Our projects, our recent success in hosting the 2003 Section 4-S conference, our lodge leadership, and our overall sense of


pride as Arrowmen have been touched by Dave's wisdom and passion for the Order and cheerful service.










