This was the first Seminars where the host lodge implemented a theme for the weekend. A fun time was had by one and all, and Rick Obermeyer did his Seminole cooking session for the umpteenth time in a row. Isn't it time for an anniversary patch for his seminar?

Chapter issues. Most of the new OA issues in the last three months for Florida have been for chapters, either for the purpose of identity, or for event participation. Tipisa 326 has issued the most over the years, but this could be caused more by the nature of how their chapters have been organized (strong leadership and programs at the chapter level that have been running their own Ordeals for at least thirty years) then

for other chapters in other lodges. No matter what the cause, keeping track of the new items, especially the rare items (< 100 made) will be difficult without assistance from the readers sharing the knowledge with others.

1993 SILK SCREENED SECTION CONFERENCE HOST NECKERCHIEF

Some fortunate individuals on eBay picked up an item that had not previously been reported to exist. Florida collectors will recognize the design as the 1992 Section SE-1 Conference, hosted by Eckale Yakanen Lodge 552. Many are familiar with how the lodge's embroidered host neckerchief was issued after the 1993 Section Conference, due to issues with getting the order correct. So, imagine the surprise of finding a silk screened version, and also using the wrong year.

So, what's the story? According to a former leader of the lodge...

In 1992, the lodge placed an order for 94 host neckerchiefs with National Supply. When the order was received, the lodge was disappointed to find that the neckerchiefs were silk screened, and not embroidered. Complaints were made about this issue, but National refused to re-make them as embroidered neckerchiefs, until it was brought to their attention that the wrong year was on them. National agreed to remake them as embroidered, but all of the silk screened Even the pieces were to be returned. embroidered version was a disappointment, with a smaller area of embroidery than what had been expected.

As the story goes, a District Executive of Sunnyland Council took it upon himself to retain six of the 94, and sent the rest back to National for destruction. And none of them had made an appearance prior to the eBay sale in September. The description of the item on the listing stated that it was a neckerchief from the 1993 Conference, without giving the full history of the piece.

Should this be listed as an official item in the Eckale Yakanen 552 collection, or the Florida Area/ Section Conference set? It was ordered by the lodge to commemorate the event they hosted, but this was never meant to be available. It would seem to be more

"official" than the Z-1 chenille, created by a lodge member after 552 was absorbed into Osceola Lodge 564. A quantity of six surviving pieces seems to be too large to be called a prototype. For now, it will remain an unusual, and extremely rare curiosity item.

NEW ISSUES

> The biggest producer of emblems for the OA in Florida for the last few months was not a lodge, but a chapter: **Tipisa 326's Tomoka Chapter** marked their 50th anniversary with two neckerchiefs (**N-2**, poly-cloth; **N-3**, satin), one jacket patch (J-1), and three pocket patches (**X-10**, for the 50th anniversary; **X-11**, GLD monochrome version of X-10; and **X-12**, for the 50th anniversary of the first chapter meeting).

Not far behind was Tipisa's "naked blue guys", Elauwit Chapter, with four new patches of their own. X-8 is for members that have been in the chapter for three years (160 made), X-9 for five year members (140 made), and X-10 for seven year members (125 made). Another version (X-11) is for everyone, with glow-in-the-dark threads.

Astatula Chapter ran their district's Camporee, and made two patches for the event; full color for attendees (300 made;) and GLD monochrome (100 made) for the staff)

More new Tipisa Chapter items have come from Klallam Chapter (X-1; regular issue), Wewahitchka Chapter (X-15?; 2007 Section Seminar attendees; GRN monochrome, 15 made); Miconope Chapter (X-13; BLK monochrome, flap-shaped), and Estiote Chapter (X-2; RED border, no lettering).

> Echockotee 200's chapters have been busy as well. Oglala Chapter made a patch to commemorate their second straight "Best All-Around Chapter" win, as well as the passing of two longtime chapter members (R-1; 100 made). They also made a patch for staffing their district's 200 Camporee (50 made). Saturiwa Chapter created their first emblem, for the passing of one of their members (R-1; 100 made). Onathequa Chapter staffed their district's Camporee, and made an item for themselves (75 made).

Timuquan 340 has remade a few of their own chapter patches. Yahi Yaha Chapter has corrected their smaller sized brown mylar border with a patch at the regular size (X-6), and Outina Chapter has made their latest version with a green border (X-6).

Now, for lodge issues.....

- > O-Shot-Caw 265 has their latest LEC flap (S-122), and once again a patch restricted to the leadership of the lodge. Another new lodge patch is for an event, but does not have the name of the event on the item (X-44). This was made for participants of a party for past lodge advisor Ron Bell, an invitation-only event, and distributed at one per person. And at their recent "Brotherhood Fellowship", the lodge finally released their bullion reproduction of the F-4 flap (B-5).
- > Semialachee 239 hosted the 2007 Section S-4S Seminars, and instituted a "Mardi Gras" theme to the event. Their host flap (S-70; 500 made) shows their Seminole totem in a clown hat.
- > Central Florida Council has another slew of new shoulder patches, nine in all. One for their Philmont Fall Trek (200 made), two for the renaming of the "Winn-Dixie Scout Reservation" to the "Leonard & Marjorie Williams Family Scout Reservation" (GLD mylar, SMY mylar borders; 1000 made of each), and a new set of six CSPs for the 50th anniversary of space flight; 500 were made of each. There is also an unofficial CSP, made for a Sea Scout post in the council.
- > North Florida Council made a CSP for attendees for this summer's Brownsea program (SA-??), with 100 made. A newly found issue from the council was the 2006 Scottish Jamborette Contingent (SA-??).
- > West Central Florida Council has finally released their 2007 FO\$ patch, for an unreported donation.
- > The Newsletter doesn't cover camp patches all that often any more, but a new item was made this summer, for McGregor-Smith Scout Reservation. This was formerly the property of South Florida Council, until the land was sold to the Southwest Florida Water Management District. They have since leased the property to Gulf Ridge Council, creating a new patch for an old camp.













The rumor mill

* We've heard that 2008 will be a big year for some chapters of **Tipisa 326** to celebrate 50th anniversaries, so save your money. There will also be a fourth 50th Anniversary patch by **Tomoka Chapter**, available only to chapter members.

2008 will also be the 50th anniversary of the Tipisa Lodge Box. While the 25th anniversary patch in 1983 was made in jest, the recent sales of them on eBay for over \$500 is no laughing matter. So the planned 50th anniversary may be an actual lodge issue.

* Echockotee 200 has ordered 250 flaps for the ArrowCorps⁵ 2008 trip. Orders were taken from the members of the lodge, sold for \$15 each. A sample had been made with the US Forestry Service logo, right before the National OA Committee put the word out that this logo was not to be used by individual lodges.

* Speaking of ArrowCorps⁵, the Section S-4S Council of Chiefs decided at the Seminars to make three patches for the summer of 2008, as fundraisers for the service program and other Section needs. **O-Shot-Caw 265** will also be making a flap and a patch for AC⁵. There may be other AC⁵s to be issued, but no other lodges are talking.

* North Florida Council will be holding their first Winter residential camp this month, and all participants will receive a commemorative CSP.

* Central Florida Council will commemorate the 20th anniversary of the Sunshine Trade-O-Ree, with a special CSP.

notes & asides

* Like many lodges in the state, O-Shot-Caw 265 has their theme of weekend patches determined by the Lodge Chief. For 2008, their patches will be depicting lodge and OA themes in the style of 1960s psychedelic rock concert posters. Echockotee 200's chief, a veteran of the OA Ocean Adventure program in the Keys, has determined that their set will

feature life on a Florida reef.

* The theme for the **Tipisa 326** 2007-2008 series is "Northwest Indian items". Thus far, the series has featured a mask and a hat.

* Timuquan 340 began its 2007-2008 series at their Summer Conclave. Their theme is very original: "Vintage Muscle Cars". So far, the designs have depicted a 1969 Camaro SS and a 1967 Corvette 427.

* Discussions on PATCH-L have led many to believe that ArrowCorps⁵, the national service project planned for the Order of the Arrow in the summer of 2008, will be a major patch event. Many lodges have planned for at least one patch, or a two piece set, while some have people have talked of their lodges' plans for multiple sets involving the different locations. One lodge, Tahosa 383 in Colorado, is planning for 30 different patches, six for each of the five locations.

Meanwhile, the National Committee notified the lodges in October that the United States Forest Service has given the National Committee limited permission to use the USFS logo, and that lodges do not have permission to use it.

It appears that most of the lodges in the state will be attending the week at the Washington-Jefferson National Forest, with a few members filtering out to the other four sites.

* The 20th annual Sunshine Trade-O-Ree will be held February 8-9, 2008 at Camp Down, in beautiful downtown Windermere (near Ocoee, suburban Orlando). For more information, go to http://www.sunshinetor.com/
